Subject of the Moot Court:

- Subject of the proceedings: Respect for private life versus freedom of opinion (freedom of the press)
- Thorough discussion of the jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights on the so-called Caroline Judgements (Nos. 59320/00, 40660/08 and 60641/08)
- The parties (student groups) will prepare written memoranda (for the claimant and the responding state) and will present them in simulated court proceedings
- A third party (the professors) will represent the panel of judges, Prof. Dr. Jaensch will direct the proceedings
